Balls shrink under pressure

Holman changes team name again

The Balls were not quite as big Sunday afternoon.

After starting out hot with two wins on the opening day of play in the Oakland A's/Seattle Mariners Fantasy Camp Friday, The Balls withered under a seven-run onslaught from Team Juiced in the sixth inning Sunday afternoon.

"We scored those seven runs and Shooty went into his full pouting mode," Juice co-manager Mike Moore said following the game.

Balls manager Shooty Babitt's only comment was a terse, "I'm not fucking talkin to the press today."

The Juicers, led by Moore and

Jose Canseco, leaped to the top of the camp standings with a two-win day. They defeated Brian Holman's inept but well-meaning and sincere squad by a score of 7-3 in another come-from-behind win. The Juicers were trailing 3-2 after six innings, but broke the game open with five runs over the final three frames.

Holman's squad was initially named the Sons-a-Pitches. After they were mauled by The Balls 21-1 on Sunday, he renamed them the No-hit Bitches. And when they lost to Hitless In Seattle 14-4 Sunday afternoon, they became The Lollipop Guild.

Holman was so distraught he

could not cope with a grilling by the media.

His co-manager, Gary Wheelock, though, said Sunday was a “good news/bad news” day for his team.

“The good news is, we’re scoring more runs in every game we play. The bad news is we’ve given up 44 runs and scored eight.”

Keith Comstock was considerably more upbeat after his Hitless In Seattle squad won both ends of their Sunday doubleheader.

They defeated the Multiple Scor-gasms, managed by Gil Heredia and Tony de Francesco, by a score of 13-8 in the morning, then added their afternoon win over the Lollipops to tie up the Balls in second place at 2-1 in the standings.

When asked how his day had gone, Comstock said, “Today was much better. My congestion is clearing up and the mucus and the chills are almost gone. Or were you talking about baseball?”

The Scor-gasms jumped out to a 4-2 lead after two innings, but surrendered 10 runs to the Hitlesses in the third inning. They were never able to recover and slipped to fourth place in the standings with a 1-2 record.

Heredia and De Francesco blew off the post game press briefings Sunday afternoon, and will be fined by the league office.
